APCO has worked closely with GS1 Australia to explore how the National Product Catalogue can **support** our Members with their **APCO Annual Reporting requirements**.

The partnership means that fields relating to **55% of APCO Annual Report questions have been incorporated** into the GS1 National Packaging Catalogue (NPC)





Our Purpose

National Product Catalogue (NPC)





Maintain and share product and item information with all trading partners in real-time

Data Synchronisation Improve data accuracy and alignment between all trading partners in the supply chain.

Digitisation of data Exchange product and item data electronically for operational efficiency.

Cost Savings Reduce costs and administration.

Data Integrity Minimise data errors and duplications.



How does it work?

- Supplier checks product range and prepares data (load via UI or integrated from an ERP)
- Product and pricing data is validated according to industry and recipient rules
- Once validation is passed the data is published to the NPC
- Data is received by one or many recipients, synchronised to their ERP systems



Product data is common to all – Price data is customer specific



The need





- Reporting requirements for packaging sustainability will become increasingly important.
 - Capturing of packaging data not currently mandated
 - Changes to retail and supply chain regulations in 2025 mean data requirements around recording packaging components will evolve.
 - A shift towards a situation where a range of incentives both formal (legislation) and informal (consumer sentiment) incentivise brand owners to start recording and sharing this information.



The Data Model





- Needs to strike a balance between:
 - Detail/ granularity and ease of use.
 - Mandatory vs. comprehensive attributes.
- Needs to be validated with manufacturers and recipients of the data who are members of both GS1 and APCO
- The NPC provides a platform to facilitate the capture and sharing of required packaging sustainability information.
- Significant overlap between APCO and GS1 membership and NPC usage



The NPC data model





- With some development work the NPC is well placed to support the reporting requirements for APCO's Annual Report.
 - Introduction of new attributes to the NPC
 - Currently the NPC supports only main packaging materials but we can extend recycled and renewable materials requirements to all levels of packaging.
 - Changes introduced to support APCO reporting requirements would require publishers to enter all packaging materials.
 - New business validation rules to be activated for APCO only members



NPC Support for APCO Annual Report





Approach:

Capture packaging sustainability information at the GTIN level.


GTIN level information can then be used along with production or sales data (where applicable) to derive the information required to accurately complete key questions within the APCO annual questionnaire

Required NPC Development & Community Updates

- New 'local' attributes (not supported by the global GDSN community)
- New 'global' attributes (supported by the global GDSN community)
 - New code lists (associated with new 'global' attributes)
- ALL packaging material to be entered material type, material percentage + recoverable status.
 - Current practice is to enter the primary packaging material only (if at all)
- Business validation rules to be developed and applied for APCO members only

National Product Catalogue



1. How many Principles of the SPGs has the packaging been reviewed against?

- This question comes supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Whole number response.
- How many of the 10 Sustainable Packaging Principles of the Sustainable Packaging Guidelines (SPGs) your business considered in the design and/or selection of packaging for this product.



2. Date when packaging was last reviewed against the SPGs.

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Date (DD/MM/YYYY).
- Date when you last reviewed this product/SKU against the Sustainable Packaging Guidelines (SPGs).



3. Has material weight been reduced for material efficiency optimisation?

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Yes/No.
- If you answer yes, your packaging must be deemed optimised for material weight.
 - Optimised = no further reductions in packaging weight or volume are possible at the present time, without compromising product quality and safety.



4. Material weight reduction amount.

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Whole number response.
- If you answer yes to the question 3, your packaging must be deemed optimised for material weight.
 - Optimised = no further reductions in packaging weight or volume are possible at the present time, without compromising product quality and safety.



5. Date when material weight was reduced for material efficiency optimisation.

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Date (DD/MM/YYYY).
- Date when this product's material weight was deemed 'optimised'.
 - Optimised = no further reductions in packaging weight or volume are possible at the present time, without compromising product quality and safety.



6. Has the packaging been assessed through PREP?

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Yes/No.
- This question requires you to indicate if the product/SKU
 has been assessed through the Packaging Recyclability
 Evaluation Portal (PREP). PREP can be used to review
 your packaging portfolio and identify whether the
 packaging components are recyclable and not-recyclable.



7. Is packaging labelled for disposal or recovery?

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Yes/No.
- This question requires you to indicate if the product/SKU has on-pack labelling, informing the consumer how to dispose of the packaging at end-of-life.



8. Does the retail packaging have an ARL artwork onpack?

- This question supports APCO Annual Reporting.
- Yes/No.
- This question requires you to indicate if the product/SKU has the Australasian Recycling Label (ARL) on-pack.



9. Number of recyclable components.

- This question supports ARL Reporting.
- Whole number response.
- For this question you will be required to provide a whole number of components that are recyclable at end-of-life.
 Components refer to different packaging items that must be separated to consumer or access the product.



10. Number of conditional recyclable components

- This question supports ARL Reporting.
- Whole number response.
- For this question you will be required to provide a
 whole number of components that are conditionally
 recyclable at end-of-life. Components refer to different
 packaging items that must be separated to consumer or
 access the product.



11. Number of non-recyclable components

- This question supports ARL Reporting.
- Whole number response.
- For this question you will be required to provide a whole number of components that are not-recyclable at end-of-life.
 - Packaging is not-recyclable if it cannot be collected, sorted, and recovered at end-of-life, in practice and at scale.

- Certification number (I.e., Home Compostable AS5810-2010)
- Certification Effective Start Date
- Packaging Sustainable Feature (I.e., made from recycled material)
- Is CDS applicable to Trade Item?
- Packaging Material Composition Quantity
- Packaging Material Type Code
- Is Trade Item Single Use Plastic?
- Recycled Packaging Content Percentage
- Packaging Feature Code
- Is Packaging Marked as Returnable?
- Packaging Recycling Scheme






